



Guiding you through water leakage



1 Whilst visible water leaks are easy to spot, leaks below ground can run for a long time without being detected and therefore cost your business a lot of money.



4 When a water leak occurs within the boundaries of your land then it will be your responsibility to fix the water leak, so detecting it early is important.



2 Regular reading of your meter to monitor usage can help identify if there is a water leak taking place.



5 Small water leaks can have a massive effect on your water consumption and in many cases are very easy to fix. For example a leaking toilet could cost your business an extra £300 per year.



3 The water industry regulator OFWAT estimates that around a quarter of all water in the supply network is wasted due to leaks on the customer-side pipe network, equivalent to 3.123bn litres every day. A leak of one cubic meter per hour costs on average £70 each day or £25,000 over the course of a year.
